From a small alliance of concerned refugee women, ReWA has grown to become one of the largest refugee and immigrant service providers in the Puget Sound. Since its inception, ReWA has helped thousands of refugee and immigrants achieve self-sufficiency and become happy and successful members of our communities.

Our Mission:

Refugee Women’s Alliance (ReWA) is a non-profit, multi-ethnic organization that promotes inclusion, independence, personal leadership, and strong communities by providing refugee and immigrant women and their families with culturally and linguistically appropriate services.

ReWA advocates for social justice, public policy changes, and equal access to services while respecting cultural values and the right to self-determination.

Our Services:

Family Empowerment: Comprehensive case management support to help families achieve self-sufficiency, including interpretation services, referrals, workshops, and application assistance.

Domestic Violence and Anti-Human Trafficking: Legal assistance, community outreach, support groups, and case management services for survivors of domestic violence, sexual assault, and human trafficking.

Early Learning Center: Licensed and accredited dual-language childcare and preschool classes that prepare children for Kindergarten and beyond.

English-as-a-Second Language Classes: ESL classes provide newcomers with a positive environment to help them gain and improve English language skills and break down the barriers to employment.

Employment and Vocational Training: Job readiness training, job search support, placement assistance, and retention services for recently arrived refugees.

Housing and Homelessness Prevention: Emergency help for refugees and immigrants who are homeless or at risk of homelessness, including rental and utility assistance and case management.

Licensed Behavioral Health: Mental health counseling, consultation, support groups, and case management in clients’ native languages.

Naturalization and Legal Services: Citizenship classes, green card and naturalization application assistance, advocacy at Immigration interviews, and free monthly legal clinic.

Senior Services Social networking opportunities with other neighborhood residents, including activities that reduce isolation and promote emotional health and well being.

Youth Program: Support of academic excellence, including tutoring, while building youth leadership and job skills.
